Girls can lead companies.


Boys can be nurses.

Now we will split into groups, and each group will get a special card. This card has a hero on it. Your job is to learn about your hero, give them a name, and think of what makes them special. After that, draw your hero and come up with a short story about their adventure.

Then, your group will present your hero and act out their story!

Work together in your groups to draw your hero and think about what makes them special.

- What does your hero look like?
- What is their superpower?
- Do they help others, explore new places, or stand up for people?

How does your hero use their strength to help others?





Hero Character Card 5: The Compassionate Healer

Write your hero's name:	
How does your hero heal others?	
What special powers or skills does your hero have?	
How does your hero make others feel better?	





Who Is Your Hero?

Each group will introduce their hero to the class!

When presenting, share:

- 1. Hero's Name: What is your hero called?
- 2. **Hero's Special Powers:** What makes them unique? Are they brave, kind, strong, creative?
- 3. **Hero's Story:** What problem does your hero solve? How do they help others?
- 4. **Hero's Personality:** Is your hero funny, serious, calm, or full of energy?
- 5.**Hero's Strengths:** How do these strengths show that anyone-boy or girl-can be a hero?





What Did We Learn?

Heroes Can Be Anyone: Boys and girls can have the same strengths and talents!

Breaking Stereotypes: We've learned that everyone can do what they love, no matter their gender.

Girls can lead, be strong, and enjoy sports.

Boys can be kind, care for others, and express emotions.

Everyone is Unique: Just like our heroes, we are all different and special in our own ways.

Teamwork: Working together helped us share ideas and celebrate everyone's strengths!
